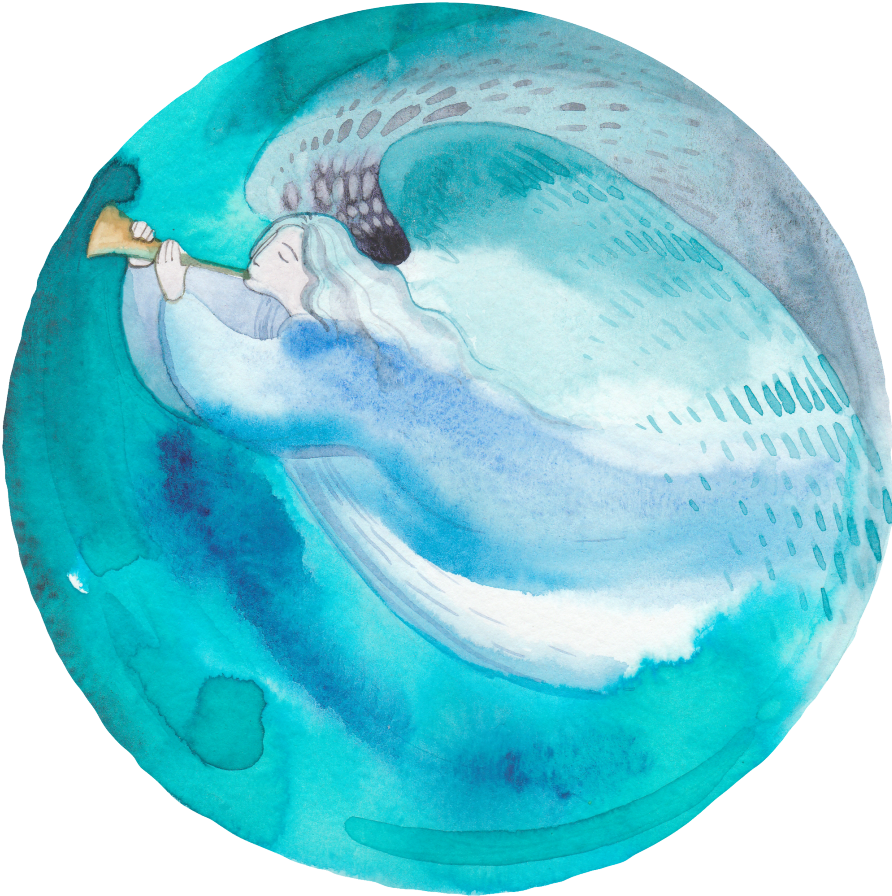



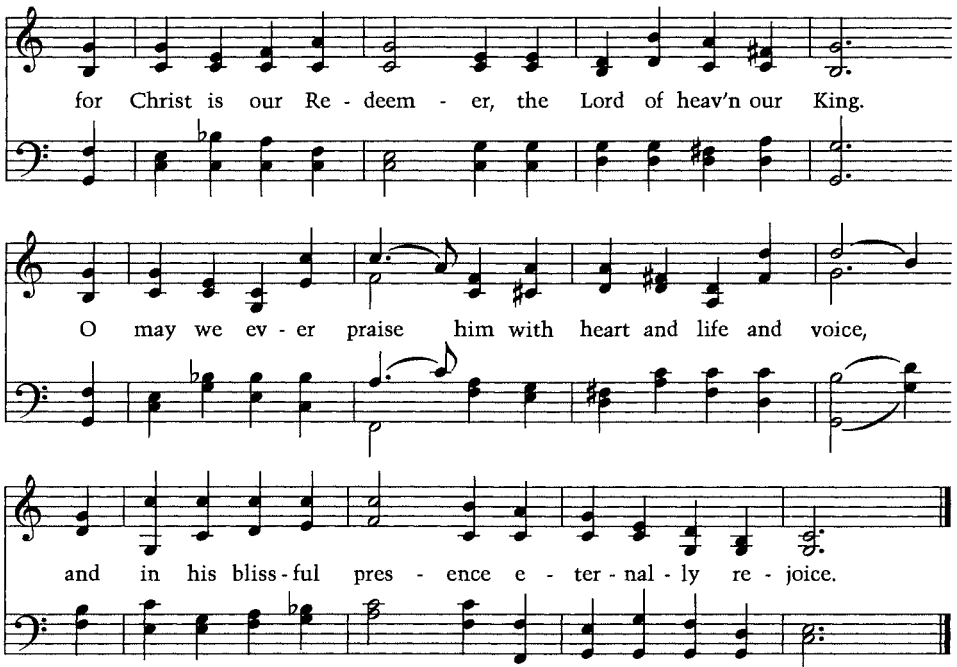

ADVENT DEVOTIONALS

This Advent, we are providing copies of “The Dawn Chorus: An Advent Devotional on the Wonders of Birds” for anybody that would like an Advent devotional to guide them on their journey to Christmas.
