We are so blessed to have the commitment to music we share at Calvary. The many members that make up our myriad ensembles and the countless hours they dedicate each year to the ministry and worship of our church is inspiring.

Our Band Director, Brian Lott, and the ensemble of players that enhance our worship service each week are incredibly dedicated and much appreciated. Their music here at Calvary and as a part of the wider Moravian Funeral Band provide comfort, joy, peace, nostalgia, and hope at all the varied times in which they offer their time and talents.

Our Calvary Ringers never fail to ring out their message in worship every time they play. Their dedication to weekly practice, the laughter and learning that takes place, and their love of playing (and counting!) in the midst of our worship each season is such a wonderful blessing!

Our children and youth pass on traditions of our church with their annual Hosanna and Morning Star, as well as other small ensembles, and solos they sing or play as an offering to God. We enjoy their dedication weekly on violin, piano, small choral ensembles, and as soloists. How fortunate we are to have them ready and willing to share their gifts with us!

We are also blessed by other resident musicians who play various instruments like guitar, flute, trombone, trumpet, oboe, and piano, as well as offering their vocal talents in various solos and duets throughout the year.

He is from Concord, NC, and is currently completing his junior year. We are fortunate to have two basses as a part of our program: Jacob Burnette and Barrett Bailey. Jacob is a rising senior Composition major from Forest City, NC, who received two prestigious scholarships for his studies at UNCSA. Additionally, he spent last summer as a SECU public service intern, working with the Charlotte Symphony. Finally, Barrett is a rising junior Composition major from Wilmington, NC. Like his colleagues, he has received much acclaim and several awards for his compositions, as well as numerous vocal performance opportunities on campus in both the School of Music and the School of Drama.
