
The flowers placed in the sanctuary are given to the Glory of God and in loving memory of Jerry Wood by the family.

Minutes of Church Council 4 May 2025

Brother Chaz Snider called the Church Council to order and opened with prayer.

Review of 2024 Winter Council Minutes

Minutes of the 2024 Winter Church Council were read by the congregation. Spencer Bullins made a correction of the date from November 11 to November 24, 2024.

Motion: By Bill Seippel and seconded by Justin Stultz, to approve the minutes of Winter Church Council with date correction. Motion carried.

Presentation of 2024 Report from the Board of Elders

Chaz Snider gave an overview of ministries and reflections of the past year at Calvary:

- There continues to be a focus on gratitude and spiritual renewal in worship.
- Attendance was strong with peak attendance during high holy days.
- Calvary participated in the downtown overflow shelters this fall with The Dwellings Ministry. Many of our members participated as volunteers for meals and other duties. The Elders will examine continued participation based on community needs.
- Calvary's staff experienced adjustments to personnel:
 - Loss of Helen Pelkey as Director of Children, Youth and Families Ministry with her relocation back to Texas. We are grateful for her work and development of this ministry during her tenure.
 - Retirement of Gordon Cranfill as Facilities Manager after eight years of service. Spencer Bullins has assumed the role of Chair of the Buildings and Grounds Committee to attend to facility services at this time.
 - Rev. Dr. Nola Knouse continues in her role of part-time Pastor of Pastoral Care and Visitation. She provides care for our members and participates in all aspects of worship services.
 - Amanda Schubert starts her sabbatical on May 19 for a three month period.
 This will be a time of rest and renewal for Amanda.
 - Ministry to Children, Youth and Families has included:
 - · Laurel Ridge Camp
 - · CE Committee activities for youth
 - · Sunday school and nursery volunteers
 - · Completed catechism class and service to confirm the new congregants

Chaz thanked each congregation member for their service to Calvary and continued support. We look forward to a year that addresses needed repairs to the building and grounds and maintains a sustainable growth to our facility.

Report from Trustees and Review of 2025 Budget

Brother Bill Seippel reported on the 2025 budget and distributed copies of the Financial Report and description of Investment Funds. There is a net loss of \$65,500 after investment draws of \$125,000 for 2024. The draws are based on 4% of investment balance on 12/31/23. The true deficit is \$191,000 which represents spending not covered by congregational support. The adjusted Net total after investment activity is \$121,325. This is unrealized gain in the market. Most of this has been negatively impacted by current market performance. Calvary has \$1,887,472 available for use in non-restricted accounts. Brother Seippel reviewed the full financial report including the list of investment funds, where held with descriptions and restrictions. We are fortunate to have these resources, but continue to have a giving problem. We need to engage all members to contribute as they have been blessed for Calvary to continue to flourish. There is a detailed financial review to the congregation scheduled for June 8th following worship. This review will include:

- 1. The role of the Trustee
- 2. Budgeting process
- 3. More details on the Invested funds such as restricted, designated and unrestricted
- 4. Bequests and how to decide their use
- 5. Q&A on current finances and any questions from previous year
- 6. Capital Fund Campaign

The goal of this report will be to provide transparency to Calvary's finances. The Feasibility Study recently conducted by the PEC will help direct fundraising and spending priorities for ongoing projects, including roof and steeple repairs.

Building and Grounds Report:

Brother Spencer Bullins reported on Building and Grounds Committee (B&G) activity. Gordon Cranfill recent retired after 8 years of service. The B&G committee reviewed over 20 service agreements/contracts Gordon interfaced with during this time. Some services include inspections such as fire safety and security alarms. The committee members divided up the contacts into smaller groups and assigned responsibility.

Terry Trivette will interact with the HVAC and JAC system.

Danny Harrison is a certified electrician and will interface with these issues.

Nick Stone will work with Pest and Lawn services and come on site for issues that pop up.

Ron Bell will deal with alarms and alarm system.

Spencer Bullins will interact with the Fire Marshall and other inspectors.

Jacob Patrick is working on an accounting for security key fobs distributed at present and will work with B&G to add and delete these as needed.

Stephen Baker works with Allied Reality in the management of our two rental properties.

Brother Bullins reported that volunteers should not be expected to maintain our facility in the long term, but will assume these responsibilities for now in the absence of the facility manager position vacated by Gordon Cranfill.

Brother Chaz Snider called for any questions from the congregation. Sister Elaine Palmore asked when the congregation will receive feedback on the Feasibility Study. The Joint Boards have recently received a report from Laura Watson with the PEC and are reviewing for next steps. This may become part of the detailed financial meeting scheduled for June.

Adjournment:

As there was no further business to come before the Church Council, the meeting was adjourned.
